

Larry Allen Honored For 30 Years Of Service To GMC



GMC recently had the honor of recognizing Larry Allen for his 30 years of dedication to GMC. A check for \$10,000 was donated by the GMC Bulldog Club for the Larry Allen Prep Endowment and an additional \$12,001 was added to the endowment, making it \$22,001!

Mr. Larry has been working with the Bulldog Club for 30+ years. He has served as the President on at least 3 different occasions. He was in charge of the football program for many years. Prior to the relocation of the football concession stand, Larry was in charge of concessions for football, baseball, and basketball for more than 15 years. Mr. Larry has been the clock operator for the basketball programs for the last 20 years.

Remembering LTG Max W. Noah (Ret.)

It is with deep sadness that we relay the passing of GMC Alumnus, Lieutenant General Max W. Noah, USA (Ret.).

General Noah and his wife, Priscilla, have been active and dedicated supporters of Georgia Military College for several decades.

He was born during the Great Depression and attended GMC elementary and high school, receiving his appointment to the United States Military Academy through GMC. "That was like a light from heaven opened up and shined on me," he once said. He was the first in his family to join the military since the Civil War.

General Noah graduated from GMC (HS) in 1948 and West Point in 1953. He was a career Army Officer in the Corps of Engineers. He commanded Army Engineer units at all levels in to include those in the 82nd Airborne Division, the 3d Infantry Division and 2nd Engineer Group in Korea, and the 18th Engineer Brigade in Vietnam. His construction experience in the Army Corps of Engineers included a variety of projects ranging from the Oahe Dam in South Dakota in the 1950's, flood control on the Upper Mississippi, and the Negev Airbases for Israel in the 1980's. From 1980 to 1982, General Noah commanded the U.S. Army Engineer School, Ft. Belvoir.

Later in his career, General Noah led analysis and financial programs at major Army Headquarters including TRADOC at Fort Monroe, VA and the Army Staff and Secretariat in the Pentagon. He developed Army programs as the Director of PA&E from 1982 to 1984 followed by four years as the Comptroller of the Army.

General Noah retired in 1988 in Alexandria, VA. And his service didn't stop in retirement. He continued to impact the Nation's defense by working for Burdeshaw Associates and later his own defense consulting firm. He also volunteered his time with numerous non-profit organizations, including the Army Historical Foundation, Georgia Military College and WPAOG's Finance Committee.

In 1982 General Noah was honored with the Georgia Military College Distinguished Alumnus award, and served as the 2011 Alumni Parade Speaker. In addition to his

service as a GMC Foundation Trustee, he also served as the 2012-2013 Annual Fund Chair.
